
## WHAT IS THE TRUE NAME OF OUR SAVIOR




NOTE: There is no letter "J" in the Hebrew alphabet. J = Y

**Num 13:8**, Joshua was one of Moses' ministers and armor bearer. His name was "Oshea", son of Nun, meaning "Deliverer". But Moses began calling him "Yahoshua" or "Yahusha", which means "Yahuah (God) is Salvation". Moses was inspired to call him Yahusha because he was a foreshadowing of the Messiah's coming to deliver and bring salvation to Israel. Joshua did what Moses was unable to do, as Yah had told him he would not be allowed to lead the Children of Israel into the promise land (Num 20:12); but Joshua, his assistant would take his place and lead Israel into victory in conquering the Canaanites in the Promised Land. After Joshua, Israel did not conquer any more significant land or nations.

**Saul, before his conversion** – had an encounter with "Jesus" on his way to persecute Christians as he had done many times before. But this time on the Damascus Rd., he had an encounter with the risen Savior. When he had fallen to the ground, he heard a voice from heaven speaking to him in the Hebrew language, asking "Saul, Saul why are you persecuting me? Paul asked who was He? The voice replied, "I am "Jesus" whom thou persecutest." But if the voice was speaking in Hebrew, what name would he have said for "Jesus"? The Greeks called him "lesous", but then the Latins called him "Jesus". The Hebrew word is "Yahoshua" (Joshua). So, Paul, after this encounter would have called him "Yahoshua or Yahusha".

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John 1:30-31, the angel Gabriel told Mary "fear not, for thou hast found favor with Yah (GOD). And behold thou shalt conceive in thou womb and bring forth a son, and shalt call his name "Jesus". Of course, he didn't say "Jesus" but Yahuhsa. So, in the OT we have Moses calling Oshea, Yahoshua (Joshua) as he was a figure that foreshadowed the coming of the Messiah, Yahusha. In the NT we have the angel Gabriel telling Mary what the Savior would be named and called. And finally, we have Paul being told directly by Yahusha himself, what his name is, speaking in the Hebrew language. The Pagan nations transliterated his name, without regard for the actual name or meaning of the name. In Ezek 39:7 ...

Yah says "So will I make my holy name known in the midst of my people Israel; and I will not let them pollute my holy name any more: and the heathen shall know that I am Yahuah, the Holy One in Israel." Yah is not going to let even Israel pollute his holy name in the future, let alone the heathen nations. So as children of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, don't you think we should start getting acquainted with the true name of both our heavenly Father and his son, our Deliverer? So, what is our Savior's true name? It is not "Jesus", which is a name the pagans gave him in the Latin language. He spoke to Paul and said "I am Yahusha" - so let it be still. Halleluyah! – means all praises to YAH!
